CONSENT AGENDA

2021-2022 BUDGET

Mrs. Fletcher moved and Mr. Senffner seconded the motion to approve the 2021-2022 budget as presented. Roll call was taken. Allayes. The motion passed unanimously.

ASSISTANT DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mrs. Edwards reported the following:

- For the past 4 years, IVVC has hosted a joint new teacher training with the career centers in Will, DuPage, and Grundy counties. After meeting with the other centers, we determined that there was not a need for a formal training this year, as IVVC does not have any new teachers and other centers had minimal new teachers. Throughout 2021-22, I will work with Grundy Area Vocational Center to create a shared drive of video and print resources for new teachers.
- The Roy Wright Memorial Scholarship will be in a pay-it-forward format this year.
 Andrew Harrelson from Plano High School will be the recipient. He was selected from a pool of 7 applicants.

CTEI AND PERKINS CONSOLIDATION

- The designated allotment for the CTEI grant for FY 21 is \$353,535. The grant application is due by August 15. Mr. Barbic is currently working on this application and he will update the Board once it is submitted and approved.
- The designated allotment for the Federal Perkins Grant is \$39,031. The grant application is due by August 15. Mr. Barbic is currently working on this application and he will update the Board once it is submitted and approved.

IVVC 2021-2022 HEALTH AND SAFETY PLAN

 Today, the Illinois Governor put a mask mandate in place for all schools. Mr. Barbic and Mrs. Edwards will finalize the plan and share it with the Board of Control and Stakeholders.

STRATEGIC PLAN YEAR 3

Goal 1 - Modernize programs in partnership with business and industry. Objectives

- A. Establish advisory committees
 - a. All program areas will meet with their advisory committees in the fall. Fall meetings will take place in a virtual or in person setting. Fall meeting agendas will be focused on Work-Based Learning. WBL Coordinator will be present at every meeting. Spring meetings will be in conjunction with Showcase Night.
- B. Committees audit curriculum
 - Review/adopt credentials, early college credit agreements

- Committees will review any certifications or credentials that can be earned by students while at IVVC.
- Examine labor market statistics
 - WBL coordinator will review local, state and national labor market data.
 - Continue to serve on the Dekalb County Economic Development Corporation Talent Pipeline Committee and Dekalb, Kane and Kendall County Workforce Board.
- o Compare program rigor to industry standards
 - WBL Coordinator will work with advisory committees to develop engagement strategies and associated outcomes.

Goal 2 - Seek innovation in program design and implementation. Objectives

- A. Research additional access points for grades 11 and 12.
 - a. Establish a Work Based Learning continuum in each career cluster.
 - b. Create opportunities for targeted student groups to engage in industry visits.
 - c. Continue to offer summer learning technical skills bootcamps.
- B. Align with home district course guides to develop pathways.
 - a. Update IVVC Course Guide to reflect Career Pathways.
- C. Continue to meet regularly with building administration and student services personnel.
 - a. Conduct a fall meeting with home school administrators and student services personnel and quarterly meetings with student services personnel.
- D. Coordinate and provide career events for home school districts.
 - a. Provide both virtual and in-person 8th grade career exploration activities.

Several Board members discussed the Work Based Learning Coordinator's role. Dr. McGuire shared the value of having seen a work based learning coordinator aid in making connections and building relationships between students and industry partners. Mr. Barbic said having a Worked Based Learning Coordinator gives more flexibility to offering on site work experiences to a variety of students in multiple programs.

Goal 3 - Measure student success.

Objectives

- A. Support home school collection and reporting of pertinent CCRI (College and Career Readiness Indicator) data elements.
 - a. Report Work-Based Learning student experiences and outcomes in both aggregate and by district regularly.
- B. Annually report data related to student achievement as defined by Precision Exams.
 - Report IVVC student achievement data as compared to national and/or state data.

Goal 4 - Maintain fiscal responsibility.

Objectives

A. Continue to maximize state and federal grants.

- Use designated CTEI increased allocation to hire Work-Based Learning Coordinator.
- b. Strategically use ESSER funds to address COVID-19 impact.
- B. Continue to investigate alternative funding sources for all programs.
 - a. Participate in Educator Pathway Grant with VALEES.
- C. Continue to investigate and create cost containment strategies which assures maintenance and improvement of current programs.
 - a. Review the following for possible cost containment:
 - i. Energy providers
 - ii. Insurance providers
 - b. Research and report tuition of career centers statewide

IVVC teachers will report for two days of institute work on August 16th and 17th.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE DATE/DROP/CURRICULUM NIGHT

Students will have 3 days of attendance to make any course changes. Curriculum night will take place on August 25 from 5:00 to 7:00pm.
